Opposition Leader Seeks Information in Wake of Abitibi Court Ruling

Opposition Leader Yvonne Jones wants direction from government about plans to help those affected by the latest developments at AbitibiBowater. The Quebec courts ruled yesterday the company was allowed to suspend top up payments to its pension program. Grand Falls-Windsor Task Force Chair, Minister Shawn Skinner, says widowers and a number of other former employees who have seen their pensions cut are not affected by yesterday's ruling. The matter came to the floor of the House of Assembly. Skinner says there are any number of workers and former employees who are waiting for word on how the company's financial woes might affect their pocket books. Skinner says as far as he understands, the CEP plans to take the case of widowers under the early retirement allowance and workers under the workforce reduction program to court.
