

## Butler tweaks government memory on snow tire issue

St. John's — Opposition government services critic Roland Butler wants an update from the provincial government on deliberations regarding the possibility of bringing in mandatory snow tire legislation.

In January, Butler asked the government to bring forward legislation requiring the mandatory use of winter tires in Newfoundland and Labrador between the months of November and May each year. Butler said the government response was that a proper assessment of the issue had not been completed.

"My preference would be for this legislation to be brought forth in the upcoming session of the legislature," Butler said. "Unfortunately, I do not feel government is as committed to such a move."

Butler recommends mandatory deadlines for the installation and removal of the tires to ensure people do not leave them on year-round, and set a mandatory tire tread benchmark so that worn-out tires are not continuously used every year.

Butler noted that in November, Quebec brought forward legislation requiring vehicle owners to install winter tires in an attempt to reduce preventable accidents and fatalities on that province's highways.

He added, that it has been proven that summer tires and all-season tires do not grip the pavement or manoeuvre in snow and ice conditions as well as winter tires.
