Opposition welcomes Premier Williams' testimony at Cameron Inquiry **LATEST NEWS**

The testimony of Premier Danny Williams at the Cameron Inquiry next week should help provide information into who knew what and when in relation to faulty breast cancer screening, Opposition Justice Critic Kelvin Parsons says.

In a news release, Parsons said that after several months of testimony at the Cameron Inquiry, he is pleased that the commission is finally nearing the end of the judicial process. He said he is hopeful improvements will be made that will ensure a similar circumstance does not happen again in the province's health-care system.

"There have been many witnesses and stories that have been very heartfelt and informative related to the faulty breast cancer screening in our province," Parsons said. "I am pleased that this process has been allowed to proceed without restriction or interference and to look into the causes of this tragedy in our health-care system."

Parsons noted the Commission of Inquiry was not without its controversy and political criticism. In correspondence the Opposition obtained under the Access to Information Act, noted Parsons, the heated struggle between the provincial government and the commission is evident.
